


We're here to

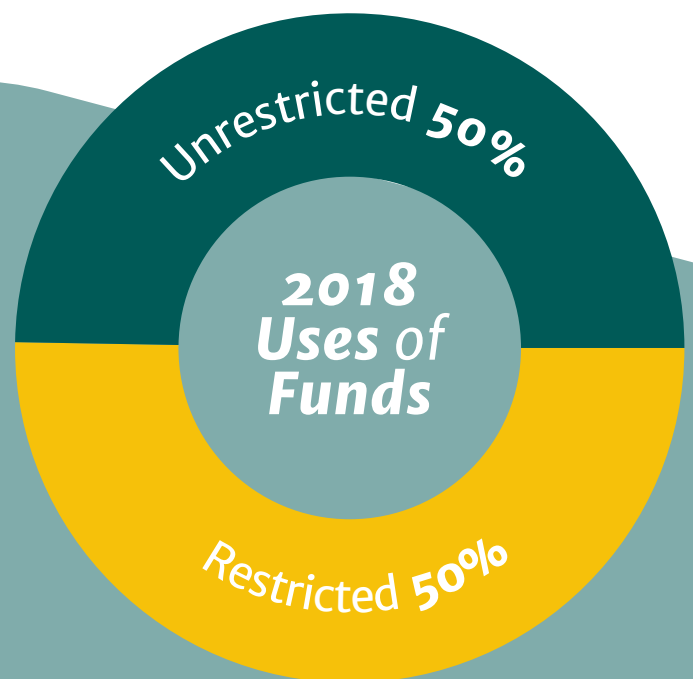
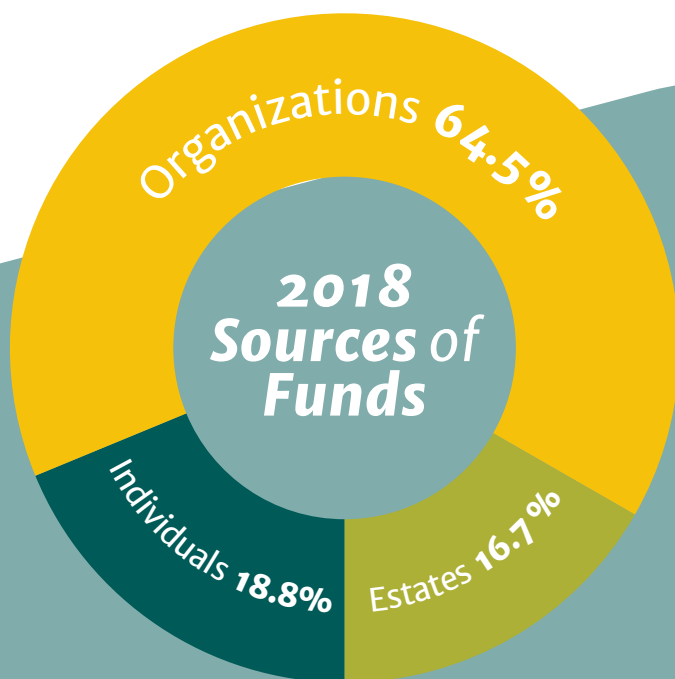
The Power of Giving

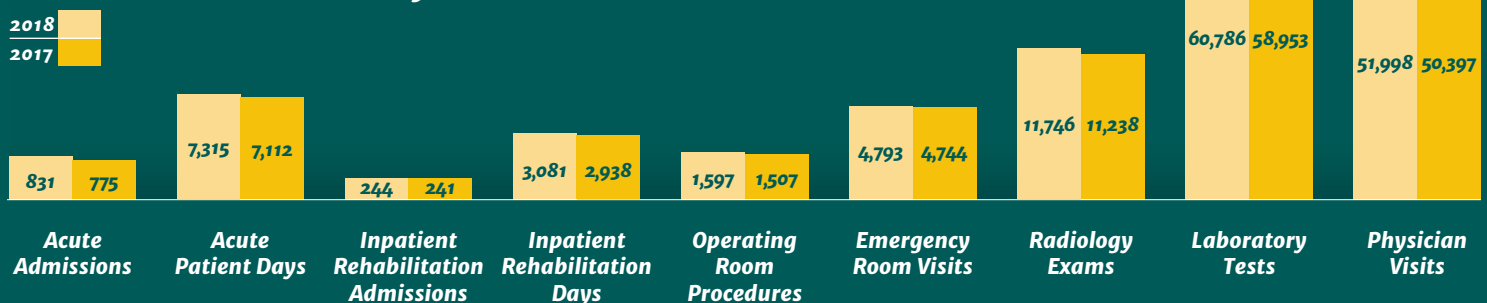
